What Is An Icing Call In Hockey - In many other leagues the icing call is automatic and play is blown dead as soon as the puck crosses the goal line. There is no need for the defenseman to touch the puck, hence the name 'no-touch' icing. Recent Modification: The rules have been altered for the 2013-14 NHL season. Icing (ice hockey) Icing is an infraction in the sport of ice hockey. It occurs when a player shoots the puck across both the centre red line and the opposing team's goal line, and the puck remains untouched. However, it is not icing if the puck is shot from behind the halfway line into the goal; if the puck crosses... Icing is a rule in hockey that is designed to prevent a team from sending the puck deep into its opponent's zone — also called "dumping" the puck — in order to run time off the clock or to avoid playing defense. Except in certain instances, a team is guilty of this when a player on his or her team's side...
